Dear Mr. Clark:

Under the North Carolina Solid Waste Management Act, 15A NCAC 13B .0563(4), permits to operate LCID Landfills are issued for not more than five (5) years. The Solid Waste Section records indicate that you have allowed the Permit to Operate the above-referenced facility to expire by not submitting a renewal application prior to the expiration of the previous 5-year permit. This is a violation of the Act and needs to be corrected immediately or you will be subject to enforcement action and/or closure of your facility.

In order to obtain a 5-year permit amendment at the above-referenced LCID Landfill and to avoid enforcement action, you must submit the following information to the Solid Waste Section by March 29, 2010:

1. A minimum of two cross-sections along each major axis per operational area that shows the current elevations, the proposed excavation, the proposed elevation at the end of the 5-year phase of operation and the proposed final elevations. The excavation drawing must show the separation to groundwater and bedrock is at least 4 feet.
2. An updated Operation Plan.
3. A completed request for Compliance History Review (attached).
4. Letter from local government stating that the LCID complies with local land use and zoning ordinances.
5. Application fee of \$500 for the 5-year permit amendment.

Should you choose not to submit the above-referenced information by the requested date, then closure of the facility must be initiated within 120 days of receipt of this letter. If you fail to choose either option, you will be subject to enforcement action, which may include injunctive action and/or the assessment of administrative penalties of up to \$15,000 per day for each day of continued violation of any requirement of the Act, the rules, or any term of condition of your permit, including the failure to properly apply for renewal of the facility's permit.

We have enclosed a guide for your application a copy of the LCID rules, including the requirements for closing down your LCID Landfill if you choose to discontinue operation of your facility.
