Mr. Parker:

The Division of Waste Management, Solid Waste Section (Section) has completed a review of the document titled *Operations Plan Scott Creek Transfer Station, Jackson County, North Carolina*, November 12, 2008. Unfortunately, another issue was found during the review that was previously missed. This issue will require another revision to the Operations Plan prior to the Section issuing a new Permit to Operate.

Section II. Operations, A. Overview states *yard trash is disposed of with the C&D and MSW in the Transfer Station building*. The Section has learned that the Official Code of Georgia Annotated (O.C.G.A.) 12-8-40.2(a)(2) places a ban on the disposal of yard trimmings at municipal solid waste disposal facilities. Therefore, you cannot allow the transport of yard trash for disposal at the Waste Management land fill in Homer, Georgia. If you wish to continue receiving yard trash at the facility it must either be composted per Rule .1400 or you must transport it for disposal at a facility that is permitted to receive yard waste. Please revise the Operations Plan accordingly for the proper management of yard trash at the transfer facility.
