Dear Mr. Bartlett:

The Division of Waste Management, Solid Waste Section has reviewed the permit application submitted for the continued operation of the City of Goldsboro Transfer Facility, Permit 96-07T. The following comments are offered. Please make changes to the application as appropriate.

1. The copies of the transfer station annual report and annual fee information do not need to be included in the permit amendment application. However, I did notice that the permit number and id in the annual report were incorrect. I notified Wes Hare of this error. You may want to note this in your records.
2. The operations plan submitted is the one that was included with a request for a permit modification in 2007 to store leaves and yard debris (DIN 4726). The request was rescinded per the city's request in 2008. Since your cover letter states that everything is the same as the original permit, could you clarify whether this was an error in the application or if you are requesting the change in operation?
3. Please state the service area for the facility in the application. Section 1.0 Waste Received only addresses the City of Goldsboro waste. The current permit issued in 2006 (DIN 248) stated that the "facility may receive solid waste that is generated within Wayne County and all its municipalities and towns, Seymour Johnson Air Force Base, and the City of Goldsboro."
4. Please describe the waste acceptance process. For example, does the facility only receive waste from service area collection services or does it also receive waste directly from the general public or businesses? Is there a scale house with attendant? Do you have signs at the entrance or in the facility? What are the operating hours of the facility?
5. Does the facility have training and screening program to detect and prevent unauthorized wastes from being accepted at the facility? If so, please include it.
6. Please indicate where waste will be sent for disposal. This was not indicated in the application. The previous permit amendment issued in 2006 (DIN 248) stated that waste is transported to the Wayne County Landfill, Permit No. 96-06.
7. Please provide a site plan that is up-to-date and includes buildings, scales, storage areas, road, fences, etc. that supports the waste management activities stated in the application. Also include

the facility boundaries. This can be an aerial photo with the buildings/areas identified as long as it legible.

The compliance history review has been completed and no issues were found. An invoice for the permit amendment fee was issued; however, payment has not been received. An application cannot be considered complete until the permitting fee is paid. In accordance with NCGS 150B-3, after an application is considered complete, the existing permit does not expire until a final decision on the application is made.
