Dear Mr. Martin:

On August 21, 2012 I received your letter regarding the City's need for the City Of Newton LCID, Permit No. 1811-LCID-2008 (DIN 17092). You stated in the letter; the City no longer needs the permit. Therefore, since the City has expressed its desire not to have this permit and since the LCID has never been constructed the Facility has been placed in an Inactive/Closed status. In order for the LCID property to be used as a permitted solid waste facility, in the future, the owner must apply to the Division, for a new permit and the Division must issue a new permit, in accordance with the requirements of NCGS 130A and 15A NCAC 13B. With regards to the 1.9 acre compost area for storing and composting of the City's leaves; from this point forward the operation will no longer be treated as a miscellaneous function of Permit No. 1811-LCID-2008 and will now be treated as a notified composting site.
