The agency has received the compliance history information you submitted for CANCO Waste Management, Inc. for a permit to construct a construction and demolition waste transfer/recycling facility. In the submittal the parent company of CANCO Waste Management, Inc., MPM Holding Company NC, Inc. and a subsidiary investment company, Terrecorp Company, was identified. As with CANCO Waste Management, Inc., under N.C.G.S. § 130A-294 (b2)(2), the agency will need to conduct a review of the compliance histories of MPM Holding Company NC, Inc. and Terrecorp Company, to determine past compliance with federal and state laws, regulations, and rules for the protection of the environment. 



TRACT THREE: All right, title and interest in and to those 50 foot wide rights-of-way shown variously as Cheek Street and unimproved rights-of-way on those plats recorded in Plat Book 1 at page 87 and 10 at page 3, Durham County Registry.

TRACT FOUR: BEGINNING at an iron stake with pointers on the northern side of Goose Creek, corner to Kennett and Beck in Fogleman's line, about 15 feet north from the bank of said creek, and running: thence North 79° 30' East 419 feet along Kennett's line to an iron stake at the fence his corner; thence North 07° 30' West 100 feet to a stake in a marked line; thence North 14° 45' West 137 feet with the marked line to an iron stake with pointers about 15 feet southward from the bank of Goose Creek; thence South 49° West 472 feet crossing the creek to the BEGINNING, containing 1.1 acres, more or less.

This is the same identical property conveyed to H.C. Kennett (now deceased) and Grace Stone Kennett by deed recorded in Deed Book 137 at page 584, Durham County Registry, and is shown on Durham County Tax Map 606, Block 1, Parcel 11.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the aforesaid lot or parcel of land and all privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging to the Grantee, its successors and assigns in fee simple.

And the Grantor covenants with the Grantee, that Grantor is seized of the premises in fee simple, has the right to convey the same in fee simple, that title is marketable and free and clear of all encumbrances, and that Grantor will warrant and defend the title against the lawful claims of all persons whomsoever, EXCEPT that no warranty of any kind is made as to Tract Three above.

When the property, or any part of this property on which solid waste has been buried, is conveyed, grantor shall place the following language upon the deed, in no smaller type than that used in the body of the deed:

"This is notification that solid waste has been disposed on this property. Questions concerning this matter may be directed to the North Carolina Department of Environment, Health and Natural Resources, Division of Solid Waste Management, Solid Waste Section, P.O. Box 27687, Raleigh, North Carolina 27611-7687."

This Closure Notice is not a permit for solid waste disposal, and is not to be construed as a permit for a disposal facility. An unpermitted open dump was established upon this property, in violation of 15A North Carolina Administrative Code 13B .0201. The site has never been a permitted solid waste disposal site, and has come to the attention of the Solid Waste Section in the context of closure of non-conforming sites/open dumps, pursuant to 15A N.C. Admin. Code 13B .0502.

The sole purpose of recording this Closure Notice is to give actual and constructive notice to subsequent purchasers of the property in order to reduce any risk to public health or the environment by the improper disturbance of the dump site.

After recording, this original instrument, affixed with the seal of the Register of Deeds, together with the date, book and page number of recording, shall be returned to:



Pursuant to North Carolina General Statutes 130A-22(a) and to 15A North Carolina Administrative Code 13B, you are hereby informed that you have established or allowed to be established a non-conforming solid waste disposal site/open dump on your property on Jones Park Drive in Durham County, North Carolina.

On December 5, 1995 I investigated a non-conforming beneficial fill operation on property owned by the Roberts Construction Co. in Durham, North Carolina, Durham County Parcel I.D. No.618-01-003E. The investigation revealed that building demolition waste has been disposed of on a ~0.25 acre area on this property. In addition to soil and inert debris, several non-inert materials were observed in the fill site, including: painted and unpainted wood and plywood, carpet, roofing material, conduit, metals, and plastics. You informed me on December 11, 1995 that the material was dumped at this site by Earth Reformers, Inc.

The Division does not regulate beneficial filling activities involving no excavation if the purpose of such activities is to improve land use potential, provided the fill material consists only of inert debris and the operations meet all conditions of Section .0562 of 15A N.C. Admin. Code 13B. A copy of this section on beneficial fill is enclosed for your reference.

The open dumping of solid waste on this property constitutes a violation of the North Carolina Solid Waste Management Rules, codified at 15A N.C. Admin. Code 13B; specifically:

15A N.C. Admin. Code 13B .0201(a) states that "no person shall establish, or allow to be established on his land, a solid waste management facility, or otherwise treat, store, or dispose of solid waste unless a permit for the facility has been obtained from the Division."

You are in violation of Section .0201(a) in that disposing of solid waste on this property constitutes establishment of a solid waste management facility on this land without a permit from the Division.

Based on the foregoing, you are hereby directed to take the following actions within 30 days of receipt of this letter to correct the violation stated in this Notice of Violation, and otherwise be in compliance with the North Carolina Solid Waste Management Rules, codified at 15A N.C. Admin. Code 13B:

- I. Remove all solid waste (other than clean soil or inert debris) from the site and properly dispose of in a facility permitted by the Division of Solid Waste Management;
- II. As documentation that the waste was disposed of properly, mail copies of all landfill receipts to:

Please be aware that pursuant to N.C.G.S. 130A-22(a) and to 15A N.C. Admin. 

Re: Conditional Approval Of The Groundwater Monitoring Plans For The Roberts Construction Company Landfills (Oak Ridge Boulevard Site and East Geer Street Site)

This Memorandum is in response to the Groundwater Monitoring Plans that were submitted to our office for the above referenced landfills. The Monitoring Plans are approved subject to the comments and conditions included in this Memorandum.

Routine detection monitoring wells are generally screened in the upper portion of the aquifer, at the water table. The wells should be designed so that the water table always falls within the screen. Actual screen depths should be determined in the field based on stabilized water table information. The wells should be constructed with 15 foot screens set so that the top of the screen is just above the seasonal high water table. This will allow for seasonal fluctuations in the water table.

On page 4 of the Monitoring Plans it states that "the bentonite seal will be allowed to hydrate for at least thirty minutes prior to placement of neat cement grout". Thirty minutes is not generally a sufficient amount of time to allow for adequate hydration of the bentonite. The manufacturers specifications should be followed for proper hydration time for the bentonite.

The sample analysis must be done using either approved drinking water analytical methods or EPA SW-846 Methodology. The upgradient wells should be located far enough away from the waste boundary to ensure that the well is not affected by disposal activities.

The Solid Waste Section should be notified at least one week in advance of the first sampling event so arrangements can be made to split samples. Copies of the Well Completion Records and boring logs should be provided to the Section at the time of sampling.

Approval of the Monitoring Plans is granted according to the following conditions:

1. The wells are to be placed within the property boundaries of the facilities in the general locations indicated on the approved plans in areas free of garbage, refuse, or debris, and in areas not subject to flooding.
2. The wells should be drilled to a depth (and likewise, the screens placed at vertical locations) that will ensure that future drought conditions, which may lower the water table, will not render the monitoring system ineffective. For the shallow wells, the top of the well screen should be placed just above the level of the seasonal high water table.
3. The monitoring wells are to be constructed according to the specifications in the "North Carolina Water Quality Monitoring Guidance Document for Solid Waste Facilities" as illustrated by the "Typical Monitoring Well Schematic" enclosed.
4. The screen should be a maximum of 15 feet in length. The sand pack should extend no more than 2 feet above the screen. A bentonite seal of at least 1.0 foot should be installed above the screened interval.
5. Well construction permits must be obtained from the Division of Environmental Management, Groundwater Section.
6. Wells must be thoroughly developed after construction in order to reduce the suspended solids, flush out the well, and re-establish equilibrium with the aquifer.


A complete and accurate Well Completion Record (DHS 3342) and Typical Well Schematic should be submitted to this office for each of the groundwater monitoring wells. In addition, a summary of the hydrogeological data accumulated from the boring operation should be provided. All boring logs and other pertinent subsurface information must be included.



COMPLIANCE ORDER WITH ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY
STATEMENTS OF FACT AND LAW

1. B. R. Roberts and Roberts Construction Company, Inc. are operating a non-conforming site/open dump located just north of Hwy 70 Bypass on E. Geer Street, Durham, North Carolina and are persons as defined in North Carolina General Statutes 130A-290 and 15A N.C. Adm. Code 13B .0101.
2. On March 1, 1971, the State of North Carolina, Department of Human Resources, Division of Health Services, Solid Waste Management Section, implemented a Solid Waste Management Program under the Solid Waste Management Act, N.C.G.S. 130A, Article 9 and rules codified at 15A N.C. Adm. Code 13B.
3. Chapter 727 of the 1989 legislative session consolidated state public health and environmental agencies within the new Department of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources. Responsibility for implementing Article 9 of N.C.G.S. Chapter 130A was thereby transferred from the Department of Human Resources to the Department of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources, and the Solid Waste Management Section became a Division of the new department.
4. 15A N.C. Adm. Code 13B contains standards and requirements applicable to the proper management of solid waste management facilities.
5. On July 10, 26, and August 14, 1990, Mark S. Fry, Waste Management Specialist, Solid Waste Section, inspected the non-conforming site/open dump located just north of Hwy 70 Bypass on E. Geer Street, Durham, North Carolina. The inspections conducted were in response to complaints received from Assistant County Attorney, Willie S. Darby, Durham County. The following violations of the North Carolina Solid Waste Management Rules, codified at 15A N.C. Adm. Code 13B, were noted at the time of these inspections.
 - A. 15A N.C. Adm. Code 13B .0201(a) requires that no person shall establish or allow to be established on his land, a solid waste management facility, or otherwise treat, store, or dispose of solid waste unless a permit for the facility has been obtained from the Division. B.R. Roberts and Roberts Construction Company, Inc. are in violation of 15A N.C. Adm. Code 13B .0201(a) in that a solid waste management facility has been established on their land without a permit from the Division of Solid Waste Management.
6. B.R. Roberts has a history of non-compliance in that he received a Notice of Violation in 1987 for the same violation at a site on Hancock Street, Durham County, North Carolina. The site has been closed, however, B.R. Roberts has been delinquent in submitting the required information so a Closure Notice can be prepared. B.R. Roberts and Roberts Construction Company, Inc. are also currently operating a non-conforming site/open dump on Oak Ridge Boulevard in Durham, North Carolina.

CIVIL PENALTY

N.C.G.S. 130A-22(a) and G.S. 130A-18 authorizes an administrative penalty of up to \$5000.00 per day for each violation of the solid waste provisions of the Act and

Rules. The N.C. Solid Waste Management Penalty Computation Procedure (March 19, 1985) was used to determine the penalty. The factors considered in determining the administrative penalty include, but are not limited to: the nature of the violations, the potential effect on the public health and environment, the degree and extent of harm caused by the violations, the costs of rectifying any damage, the types and amounts of wastes, the ease and costs of compliance and the history of noncompliance. For the violation specified above, a penalty of \$26,400.00 is assessed.

CONDITIONS FOR COMPLIANCE

Based on the foregoing, you are hereby ordered to take the following actions:

1. Within sixty (60) days of receipt of this Compliance Order with Administrative Penalty submit the amount of the administrative penalty, by check or money order, payable to the Solid Waste Management Division, and mail to William L. Meyer, Director, Solid Waste Management Division, Department of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources, P.O. Box 27687, Raleigh, N.C. 27611-7687.
2. Immediately discontinue all dumping operations.
3. Immediately post signs indicating closure.
4. Immediately prevent unauthorized entry to the site by means of gates, berms, fences.
5. By October 29, 1990 compact and cover existing solid waste in place with two feet or more of suitable compacted earth.
6. By October 29, 1990 implement erosion control measures by grading and seeding in accordance with the Sedimentation Pollution Control Law (15 N.C. Adm. Code 4). You may contact John Holly, Regional Engineer with the Land Quality Section of the Division of Land Resources at (919) 733-2314 if you have any questions pertaining to the Sedimentation Pollution Control Law.
7. By October 29, 1990 provide for the preparation and implementation of a ground water monitoring plan including well locations, depths of wells, constituents to be analyzed, sampling procedures, etc. This plan must be approved by the N.C. Solid Waste Management Section. Preparation and implementation of the ground water monitoring plan will follow recommendations from the "N.C. Water Quality Monitoring Guidance Document for Solid Waste Facilities." Questions concerning ground water monitoring should be directed to Bobby Lutfy, Solid Waste Section Hydrogeologist at (919) 733-0692.
8. Record a Notice of Unpermitted Solid Waste Disposal Site with the Register of Deeds in Durham County. The procedure for recording the Notice of Unpermitted Site follows:

The landowner(s) shall:

- A. Submit to the Section an entire copy of the property deed giving the complete legal description of the property as it is registered in the index of the county where the land is located. The description will either be by metes and bounds, or by reference to a recorded plat map.
- B. Submit to the Section a plat of the property sufficient to meet the standards for recording in the Map Index of the county where the land is located. The map must show:
 - 1. Name of owner, property lines, north arrow, scale and bearings and distances taken from the deed.
 - 2. Past and present disposal area delineated.
 - 3. Certification and seal by registered land surveyor or registered engineer.

Items #A and #B should be sent to Mark S. Fry, Solid Waste Section, Wachovia Bank Building, 225 Green Street, Suite 601, Fayetteville, North Carolina 28301.

- C. The Section will prepare a "Notice of Closed Unpermitted Solid Waste Disposal Site," which the landowner(s) shall sign and acknowledge in the form prescribed by N.C.G.S. 47-38 through 47-43.

The landowner(s) must file the Closure Notice, with the map attached where appropriate, with the Register of Deeds in the county or counties where the land is located. If the map is too large to be reduced legibly to legal size, it shall be recorded in the map index, and the Closure Notice shall reference the separately recorded plat.

The Register of Deeds shall record the Notice in the Grantor Index under the name(s) of the owner(s) of the land. After recording, the Register of Deeds shall mail the original notice instrument, affixed with the Register's seal, together with the book, page number, and the date of recording to:

POTENTIAL CONSEQUENCES OF FAILURE TO COMPLY

B.R. Roberts and Roberts Construction Company, Inc. are hereby advised that, pursuant to N.C.G.S. 130A-22, each day of continued violation of any requirement of the Act or the Rules constitutes a separate violation for which a penalty of up to \$5000.00 per day may be imposed. If the violation(s) continues, you may also be subject to further enforcement, including injunction from any further operation of a solid waste management facility, and such further relief as may be necessary to achieve compliance with the North Carolina Solid Waste Management Act and Rules.

OPPORTUNITY TO REQUEST A HEARING

B.R. Roberts and Roberts Construction Company, Inc. have the right to request an administrative hearing to contest any matter of law, material fact, requirement, or penalty set forth in this Compliance Order with Administrative Penalty. To avoid being in default and having the penalty collected without further administrative proceedings, a written petition must be submitted within thirty (30) days of receipt of this Compliance Order with Administrative Penalty in accordance with N.C.G.S. 150B-23(a) and 15A N.C. Adm. Code 13B .0704.

The petition shall be verified or supported by affidavit and shall state facts tending to establish that the agency has deprived B.R. Roberts and Roberts Construction Company, Inc. of property, has ordered B.R. Roberts and Roberts Construction Company, Inc. to pay a fine or civil penalty, or has otherwise substantially prejudiced B.R. Roberts and Roberts Construction Company, Inc. rights and that the Section:

1. exceeded its authority or jurisdiction;
2. acted erroneously;
3. failed to use proper procedure;
4. acted arbitrarily or capriciously; or
5. failed to act as required by law or rule.

The petition must be submitted to the Office of Administrative Hearing, P.O. Drawer 11666, Raleigh, North Carolina 27604, in accordance with N.C.G.S. 150G-23(a). A copy of the petition must be submitted to John Hunter, Director, Office of General Counsel, Department of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources, P.O. Box 27687, Raleigh, North Carolina 27611-7687.

Requested administrative hearings will be conducted in accordance with applicable rules contained in the North Carolina Administrative Code, a copy of which will be furnished to you upon request. If no hearing is requested, payment of the administrative penalty is due within sixty (60) days after receipt of this notice. If a hearing is requested, payment of the administrative penalty is due within sixty (60) days after service of a written copy of the decision affirming the penalty. If payment is not received as required, the Secretary of Department of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources shall request the Attorney General to commence an action to recover the amount of the administrative penalty and may also request that an injunctive action be commenced to achieve compliance pursuant to N.C.G.S. 130A-22(g).


