Hello Gail,

I've reviewed the permit for the White Street Compost Facility, and the application and operating plan, and from what you have described in your email below, the proposed changes are not inconsistent with what has been approved. Instead of mostly composting with a smaller amount of mulching/wood chips, it sounds like it will be moving to mostly mulching/wood chips with a smaller amount of compost. We do not see a need to change the permit.

If the volume increases above approx. 30,000 tons per year, however, we would need to modify the permit.

Pile size for both unprocessed wood material and for post-processed wood chips should be no larger than 30 feet high and 50 feet wide, with unlimited length within the boundaries of the site.

I will add this notification to the file. If there are any other changes that would make the operation inconsistent with the approved plans please let me know. Thanks for contacting me about this change. If you have any questions let me know.

Good Morning Donna,

We are planning some changes to our composting operations and I wanted to run it by you to see what permit and/or operations plan modifications will be required.

The City of Greensboro is in the process of procuring a new tub grinder for use at our White Street Landfill Large Type I Compost Facility, Permit No 41-03-Compost. We are currently contracting the grinding services and typically utilizing one horizontal grinder. Once we have the tub grinder, we plan to grind the majority of our yard waste for use as biomass. It will be hauled to Virginia for use in MeadWestvaco's biomass boiler. We will still separate out a small portion for compost and/or mulch but at a much smaller scale than we are doing now.
