Dear Mr. Grant:

We have received your January 20, 2000 notification letter of a proposed revision to the coal combustion by-products structural fill project identified as the J.S. Turner Saw Mill Lumber Drying Yard. The engineering drawings and other information submitted with that letter have been reviewed and it was found that additional information is required on several points to confirm that the project will be in conformance with Section .1700 of the 15A NCAC 13B Solid Waste Management Rules. The list that follows describe what the Division requires:

1. Revise site plans accordingly:
 - ✓ A.) Provide revised surface dimensions appropriate for a 10' elevation increase.
 - ✓ B.) Provide new updated cross sections for the proposed fill height.
- ✓ 2. How is 10' increase in elevation a "benefit" to the site, versus keeping the original 85' MSL. elevation over the initial site plus the expansion area.
- ✓ 3. Provide new metes and bounds to correspond to the new fill area.
- ✓ 4. Has the original project been completed in accordance with the original approved plans and has closure notification been filed at the Register of Deeds Office against the property deed? *No*
- ✓ 5. Does the October 8, 1998 Land Quality E. & S. Control Approval Plan need to be revised to include the one third acre (approximate) expansion to the original project. *Yes. Revising deed with 3 1/3 acre from E.B. Grant, Jr.*



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The Section .1700 Rules, "Requirements for Beneficial Use of Coal Combustion By-Products", are only applicable to by-products from the combustion of 100% coal. The by-products obtained from combustion of fuel blends of coal and other combustionables are not regulated under these .1700 rules. Therefore, please be aware that the by-products from the combustion of coal and petroleum coke blends recently evaluated at the Roanoke Valley Energy plant are not eligible for this project.
