Dear Mr. Cobb:

Atlantic Sewage Control received a Notice of Violation letter from the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources, Division of Waste Management (DWM) dated May 22, 2012, for SLAS-27-17. The letter was in reference to:

1. A delinquent permit application for the above referenced permit;
2. Hydraulic field loading excess on Field 1 of the above referenced permit in February of 2011.


Atlantic Sewage Control has prepared the following response to address these issues:

1. In order to properly prepare the permit application, a companywide Nutrient Management Plan (NMP) had to be prepared for all Atlantic Sewage Control permits. This master NMP dictates when and how much can be applied to a field during a given time. Since the time of issuance, a master NMP has been prepared and submitted to DWM for review.
2. Given that Atlantic Sewage Control has a large, complex and fluid operation, tracking the hydraulic field loading can be tedious. In an effort to comply with current North Carolina Septage Land Application regulations, Atlantic Sewage Control has developed a database management system to assist with this tracking. This management system allows for daily entries. In the event that a field is used extensively for a period of time, a warning will let the operator know when a field reaches 80% of the permitted

hydraulic capacity for the month. In short, if the database is properly maintained, these types of violations should be significantly mitigated.
