Dear Mike,

For your assistance, below are the closure requirements for tire collection and processing sites:

15A NCAC 13B .1109 CLOSURE OF NON-CONFORMING SITES

(a) Any scrap tire collection or disposal site which does not meet the requirements of this Section shall be closed.

(b) In closing any scrap tire site the owner or operator shall:

- (1) Prevent public access to the site;
- (2) Post a notice indicating the site is closed and the nearest permitted site where scrap tires can be deposited;
- (3) Notify the Division of the closing and obtain Departmental approval of the plan to remove tires prior to tire removal;
- (4) Remove all scrap tires, processed tires and residuals to a waste tire processing facility, solid waste management facility permitted to accept scrap tires or processed tires, a legitimate user of processed tires, or other facility approved by the Division;
- (5) Remove any solid waste to a permitted solid waste management facility;
- (6) Provide documentation that tires were received by approved facility; and
- (7) Notify the Department when closure is complete.

Dear Mike,

Thank you for speaking with Sarah Rice and me by telephone moments ago.

As we understand you, you will submit a request to us by December 31, 2013, to terminate the permit and you will remove the tires and tire remnants from the property for use in a beneficial manner.

Please be aware that all conditions in the permit and the State Solid Waste Management Regulations will remain in effect until all waste is properly removed from the property, and that you may be subject to any enforcement actions resulting from violations of those permit conditions and State regulations.

When the waste debris is removed from the property, you will need to submit a letter certifying that the property is free of waste material. Following an inspection by a Division representative confirming the property status, the permit would then be terminated.

Dear Michael,

In an effort to assist you, Ellen Lorscheider and I met with you in the Division offices Friday, November 15, 2013, to discuss the options available to help you maintain compliance with your permit conditions.

To date, you have not responded and we are aware that the office trailer is not now on site.

The options you discussed with us were, in summary:

1. Bring your financial assurance into compliance with State regulations.

2. Request a permit modification for total of 0 [zero] tires processed. This option would allow you to maintain your permit active without having to provide financial assurance. However, this option would require you to remove and properly dispose all tires and tire shreds all tires from your site.
3. Close the site according to your permit conditions and State regulations including the removal and proper disposal of all tires and tire shreds. However, this option would require you to reapply for a new permit should you choose to engage in the business in the future.

Further communication on your end is needed.

We look forward to assisting you in whatever decision you choose, but we need you to contact us and inform us of your decision by the close of business December 31, 2013. Failure to comply with your permit conditions and State regulations may subject you to compliance action, which we would prefer to avoid.

Time is of the essence in this matter.
