OTHER COMMENTS /SUGGESTIONS:

1. The permit renewal needs to be completed. A revised plan needs to be submitted with 30 days of receipt of this Audit that will complete the permitting process. **A permit needs to be secured for this facility within 90 days or close the facility.**
2. The tires have been removed from the facility and are now being collected at the landfill on Ann Street.
3. Pallets are being stored at the facility for processing. The pallets need to be on a cycle for removal.
4. The land clearing debris is being mulched and sent to South Carolina to be used as boiler fuel.
5. Efforts to close the old LCID area need to continue. The cap needs to be verified and the grass needs to be mowed prior to closure.
6. The interior ditches and previously disturbed areas have been provided with adequate ground cover.
7. The stockpiled material is being cycled well.
8. The facility is being managed well.

1. The remaining tires that are in a pile need to be disposed of properly. These tires have been there since my last Audit and need to be **cleaned up within 10 days.**
2. There is an area behind the used oil collection barrel that is being pushed off with waste debris. The waste needs to be collected and brought to the processing area. This should be completed **within 10 days** of receipt of this Audit.
3. Pallets are being stored at the facility for processing.
4. The land clearing debris is being mulched and sent to South Carolina to be used as boiler fuel.
5. The old LCID Landfill is grown up with thick vegetation. The cap needs to be verified so the old LCID area can be closed out.
6. The old LCID needs to be mowed and all uncovered debris needs to be covered or brought to the processing area to be ground.
7. The ditches that were cleaned have been provided with ground cover. **Good Job!**
8. Efforts to obtain a T&P Permit need to continue.

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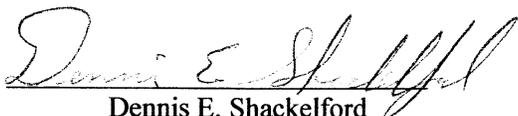

OTHER COMMENTS /SUGGESTIONS:

1. The scattered tires previously noted around the site have been picked up. There were a small amount of tires still left at this area. Efforts to reclaim this area need to continue. Tires will no longer be collected at this facility.
2. There is an area behind the used oil collection barrel that is being pushed off with waste debris. The waste still needs to be collected, properly managed and the area provided with a permanent, adequate ground cover. **This needs to be completed prior to issuance of a new permit.**
3. The used oil collection area has been cleaned up as previously noted. I would recommend a larger roof covering over this area. It appeared that rain is getting into the containment area resulting in a spill over.
4. Pallets are being stored at the facility for processing.
5. The land clearing debris is being mulched and sent to South Carolina to be used as boiler fuel.
6. Waste was being ground up today.
7. The old LCID Landfill is grown up with thick vegetation. The cap needs to be verified so the old LCID area can be closed out.
8. Adequate, permanent ground cover needs to be provided on all of the disturbed areas. The ditches were cleaned to allow the site water to properly drain. The disturbed areas need to be provided with adequate ground cover within 15 days of completion to minimize and prevent off-site sedimentation.
9. Pictures of the facility were taken today.

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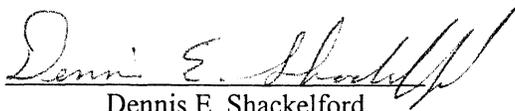

OTHER COMMENTS /SUGGESTIONS:

1. 15A NCAC 13B .1107 (c) states that "The owner or operator of any scrap tire collection site shall control mosquitoes and rodents so as to protect the public health and welfare. Whole and sliced scrap tires, and other scrap tires capable of holding water shall be covered upon receipt with a water shedding material or disposed of, processed or removed from the site within 10 days of receipt." **The scattered tires around the site need to be picked up and properly managed. The tires around the perimeter need to be free of being able to collect water if they are to be used for traffic control.**
2. There is an area behind the used oil collection barrel that is being pushed off with waste debris. The waste needs to be collected and brought to the processing area.
3. The used oil collection area has several areas where the oil has spilled onto the soil. The contaminated soil needs to be cleaned up and properly disposed of. I would recommend a larger roof covering over this area. It appeared that rain is getting into the containment area resulting in a spill over.
4. Pallets are being stored at the facility for processing.
5. The land clearing debris is being mulched and sent to South Carolina to be used as boiler fuel.
6. Waste was being ground up today.
7. The old LCID Landfill is grown up with thick vegetation. The cap needs to be verified so the old LCID area can be closed out.
8. The ditches were cleaned to allow the site water to properly drain. The disturbed areas need to be provided with adequate ground cover within 15 days of completion to minimize and prevent off-site sedimentation.
9. A site visit was done with Mr. Lyon and Ms. Wylie. The proposed permit was reviewed at this time.

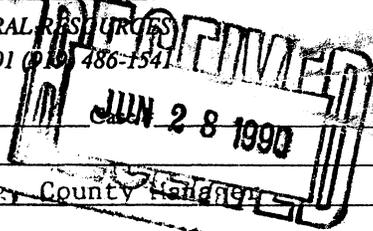

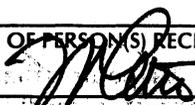

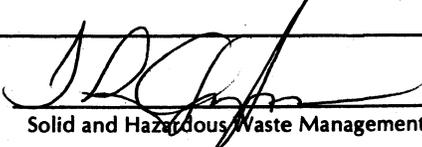

SIR: AN INSPECTION OF YOUR LAND DISPOSAL SITE HAS BEEN MADE THIS DATE AND YOU ARE NOTIFIED OF THE VIOLATIONS, IF ANY, MARKED BELOW WITH A CROSS (X).

- (1) PLAN AND PERMIT REQUIREMENTS
 - (a) Construction plans shall be approved and followed.
 - (b) Specified monitoring and reporting requirements shall be met.
- (2) SPREADING AND COMPACTING REQUIREMENTS
 - (a) Solid waste shall be restricted into the smallest area feasible.
 - (b) Solid waste shall be compacted as densely as practical into cells.
- (3) COVER REQUIREMENTS
 - (a) Solid waste shall be covered after each day of operation, with a compacted layer of at least six inches of suitable cover or as specified by the division.
 - (b) Areas which will not have additional wastes placed on them for 12 months or more shall be covered with a minimum of one foot of intermediate cover. **FIRE BREAK & COVER**
 - (c) After final termination of disposal operations at the site or a major part thereof or upon revocation of a permit, the area shall be covered with at least two feet of suitable compacted earth.
- (4) EROSION CONTROL REQUIREMENTS
 - (a) Adequate erosion control measures shall be practiced to prevent silt from leaving the site.
 - (b) Adequate erosion control measures shall be practiced to prevent excessive on-site erosion.
- (5) DRAINAGE CONTROL REQUIREMENTS
 - (a) Surface water shall be diverted from the operational area.
 - (b) Surface water shall not be impounded over or in waste.
 - (c) Completed areas shall be adequately sloped to allow surface water runoff in a controlled manner.
- (6) VEGETATION REQUIREMENTS
 - (a) Within six months after final termination of disposal operations at the site on a major part thereof or upon revocation of a permit, the area shall be stabilized with native grasses.
 - (b) Temporary seeding will be utilized as necessary to stabilize the site.
- (7) WATER PROTECTION REQUIREMENTS
 - (a) The separation distance of four (4) feet between waste and water table shall be maintained unless otherwise specified by the division in the permit.
 - (b) Solid waste shall not be disposed of in water.
 - (c) Leachate shall be contained on site or properly treated prior to discharge. An NPDES permit may be required prior to the discharge of leachate to surface waters.
- (8) ACCESS AND SECURITY REQUIREMENTS
 - (a) The site shall be adequately secured by means of gates, chains, berms, fences, and other security measures approved by the division, to prevent unauthorized entry.
 - (b) An attendant shall be on duty at the site at all times while it is open for public use to ensure compliance with operational requirements.
 - (c) The access road to the site shall be of all-weather construction and maintained in good condition.
 - (d) Dust control measures shall be implemented where necessary.
- (9) SIGN REQUIREMENTS
 - (a) Signs providing information on dumping procedures, the hours during which the site is open for public use, the permit number and other pertinent information shall be posted at the site entrance.
 - (b) Signs shall be posted stating that no hazardous or liquid waste can be received without written permission from the division.
 - (c) Traffic signs or markers shall be provided as necessary to promote an orderly traffic pattern to and from the discharge area and to maintain efficient operating conditions.
- (10) SAFETY REQUIREMENTS
 - (a) Open burning of solid waste is prohibited.
 - (b) Equipment shall be provided to control accidental fires or arrangements shall be made with the local fire protection agency to immediately provide fire-fighting services when needed.
 - (c) Fires that occur at a sanitary landfill shall be reported to the division within 24 hours and a written notification shall be submitted within 15 days.
 - (d) The removal of solid waste from a sanitary landfill is prohibited unless the owner/operator approves and the removal is not performed on the working face.
 - (e) Barrels and drums shall not be disposed of unless they are empty and perforated sufficiently to ensure that no liquid or hazardous waste is contained therein.
- (11) WASTE ACCEPTANCE AND DISPOSAL REQUIREMENTS
 - (a) A site shall only accept those solid wastes which it is permitted to receive.
 - (b) No hazardous, liquid, or infectious waste shall be accepted or disposed of in a sanitary landfill except as may be approved by the division.
 - (c) Spoiled foods, animal carcasses, abattoir waste, hatchery waste, and other animal waste delivered to the disposal site shall be covered immediately.
 - (d) Asbestos waste that is packaged in accordance with 40 CFR 61, as amended through January 1, 1985, may be disposed of separate and apart from other solid wastes at the bottom of the working face or in an area not contiguous with other disposal areas, in either case, in virgin soil. Separate areas shall be clearly marked so that asbestos is not exposed by future land-disturbing activities. The waste shall be covered immediately with soil in a manner that will not cause airborne conditions. Copies of 40 CFR 61 may be obtained and inspected at the Solid and Hazardous Waste Management Branch, Division of Health Services, P. O. Box 2091, Raleigh, NC, 27602.
- (12) MISCELLANEOUS REQUIREMENTS
 - (a) Effective vector control measures shall be applied to control flies, rodents, and other insects or vermin when necessary.
 - (b) Appropriate methods such as fencing and diking shall be provided within the area to confine solid waste subject to be blown by the wind. At the conclusion of each day of operation, all windblown material resulting from the operation shall be collected and returned to the area by the owner or operator.

 - ___ (d) Asbestos waste that is packaged in accordance with 40 CFR 61, as amended through January 1, 1985, may be disposed of separate and apart from other solid wastes at the bottom of the working face or in an area not contiguous with other disposal areas, in either case, in virgin soil. Separate areas shall be clearly marked so that asbestos is not exposed by future land-disturbing activities. The waste shall be covered immediately with soil in a manner that will not cause airborne conditions. 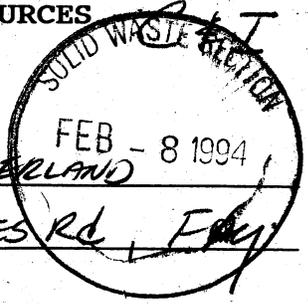

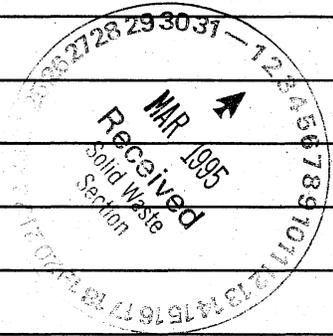

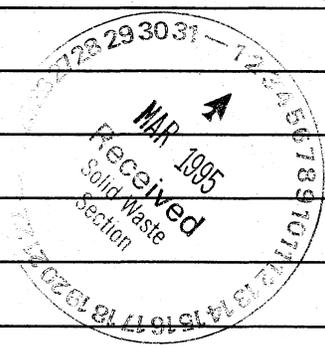
