RE: Self-monitoring Program at Craston Print Works Landfill.

Dear Mr. Greene:

The Solid and Hazardous Waste Management Branch is in the process of implementing a ground-water monitoring plan effective May 1, 1987 for all currently permitted industrial sanitary landfills within North Carolina. This plan is designed so that all facilities will be responsible for sampling their own ground-water monitoring wells on site and reporting the results to this office within 15 days of receipt.

The Solid Waste Unit ground-water monitoring personnel are currently completing a document which will stipulate approved sampling methods, frequency of sampling and sampling constituency for non-industrial (i.e. municipal) landfills. Because industrial landfills are heterogeneous in composition based upon the unique wastes produced at each facility, it is imperative for this office to establish a clear perception of what specific manufacturing processes and subsequent waste are produced at each facility in order to establish specific monitoring goals. For this reason, please complete the enclosed questionnaire in order to update our records, and return it within 15 days if at all possible to the Solid Waste Hydrogeologist.

Many industrial facilities are currently performing self-monitoring. For these industries, the primary change includes State guidance and supervision with respect to which specific parameters and environmental indicators will be analyzed and at what frequency. The State will retain the option of splitting samples periodically with the facility for comparative and statistical purposes. Within the next 60 days each facility shall receive a tentative listing of constituents to test for and at what interval, therefore, your comments and input regarding the above are requested as soon as possible.

RE: Notification Of Semi-annual Sampling Dates For Landfills

Dear Mr. Greene,

This past January a letter was mailed to all landfill owner/operators informing them that the Solid Waste Section will be requiring semi-annual ground and surface water monitoring beginning January 1, 1993. All landfill owner/operators were requested to notify the Section prior to July 1, 1992, of the months they will be performing each of their semi-annual sampling episodes for the 1993 calendar year. Please note details in the letter of January 10, 1992 that is enclosed with this letter.

As of this date the Solid Waste Section has no record of the proposed sampling dates for next year for your facility. Please notify the Solid Waste Section in writing immediately of the two months you have chosen for sampling this coming year. A response should be received in our office by October 15, 1992.
