The item(s) listed above were observed by Section staff and require action on behalf of the facility in order to come into or maintain compliance with the Statutes, Rules, and/or other regulatory requirements applicable to this facility. Be advised that pursuant to N.C.G.S. 130A-22, an administrative penalty of up to \$15,000 per day may be assessed for each violation of the Solid Waste Laws, Regulations, Conditions of a Permit, or Order under Article 9 of Chapter 130A of the N.C. General Statutes. Further, the facility and/or all responsible parties may be subject to enforcement actions including penalties, injunction from operation of a solid waste management facility or a solid waste collection service and any such further relief as may be necessary to achieve compliance with the North Carolina Solid Waste Management Act and Rules.

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS

The facility is a privately owned construction and demolition (C&D) landfill and large type 1 composting facility. The facility is permitted to receive C&D waste, inert debris, land-clearing debris, and asphalt generated within Wake County. The permit to operate shall expire on March 27, 2014. A permit renewal application must be submitted to the SWS by September 27, 2013.

1. The facility is secured by a locking gate when it is not open for operation. The correct signage is at the entrance of the facility listing the facility name, permit number and emergency contact information as well as materials accepted at the facility. The operating hours are Monday through Friday, 7:00am to 5:00pm; and Saturday 7:00am to Noon.
2. The current permit, site plan and operations plan were reviewed during the inspection.
3. Daily tonnage records were reviewed. Currently the facility is averaging approximately 300-500 tons per day of C&D waste. The permit has an annual limit of 200,000 tons per year for the Phase 2 portion of the facility. Operations are currently in Phase 2, Cell B.
4. The following are certified operators at the facility:
 - a) Roger Barnes – Certified Landfill Manager (MOLO), Cert #43189. expires April 30, 2014
 - b) Billy Steve Narron – Certified Landfill Operation Specialist, LF-2013073, expires November 7, 2016
 - c) Amy Williams - Certified Landfill Operation Specialist, LF-2011042, expires June 3, 2014
 - d) Franklin Ryan Johnson – Certified Manager of Landfill Operations, expires June 7, 2016
5. Random waste screening reports were reviewed. The facility is completing 1 or 2 recorded waste screenings per day. The screening forms include a good breakdown of the randomly selected load. The facility is also doing a very good job of tracking loads that were rejected (a separate book of rejected loads is kept). If tonnage/loads increase, the number of waste screenings should also increase to ensure that 1% of all incoming waste loads are screened.
6. Groundwater sampling results were reviewed. The groundwater is sampled semi-annually as required in the detection monitoring program. Sampling has occurred in April and October of prior years. The most recent sampling event occurred October 2013 and was reviewed onsite.
7. Landfill gas monitoring results were reviewed. The monitoring is completed by a contracted consultant. The consultant utilizes a Landtec GEM-500 for analysis of the gas. Gas monitoring was completed quarterly during 2012 and 2013. No exceedances were noted.
8. The log showing the placement of cover material was reviewed during the inspection. The facility is maintaining a record of cover placed weekly showing time, date and material. Ensure that the solid waste is covered with six inches of earthen material when the waste disposal area exceeds one-half acre and at least once weekly. When cover material is placed more frequently than weekly, that activity should also be included in the log.

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9. Compost windrow temperatures are being recorded and maintained. A review of the temperature records indicated that compost windrow temperatures are being checked and recorded weekly. **Ensure that compost windrows are being maintained at temperatures at or above 55 degrees Celsius (131 degrees F) for 3 days and all temperature readings are being documented for compost that is distributed to the public.**
10. Operational cover should be maintained to promote runoff of surface water and direct storm water away from the working face. No standing water was observed within the waste footprint during this inspection. Operators of all C&DLF units must cover the solid waste with six inches of earthen material when the waste disposal area exceeds one-half acre and at least once weekly. Cover must be placed at more frequent intervals if necessary to control disease vectors, fires, odors, blowing litter, and scavenging. A notation of the date and time of the cover placement must be recorded. The working face is currently being covered at the end of each day.

11. Windblown waste is being well managed. Ensure that windblown is collected at the end of each day and disposed of in the landfill.
12. A perimeter road is being upgraded for better access around the base of the closed areas of the landfill.
13. Material in the composting area is being maintained in windrows with adequate space between the rows. No standing water was observed.
14. Concrete and asphalt are stockpiled onsite and ground periodically. These materials are being used on haul roads at the facility.
15. New signs have been installed in both English and Spanish to demarcate all areas of the facility and serve as safety reminders.

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16. The top elevation of Cell 1 is possibly at final grade; it is scheduled to be surveyed. After final grade has been confirmed additional cover will be placed. Some erosion was observed which was exposing waste at the time of the inspection. All exposed waste should be covered or removed and properly disposed. Corrections were underway prior to the end of the inspection.
